It's hard to imagine anything more beautiful – until we encounter the low-lying Cook Islands, possibly the best-kept secret in the South Pacific. Then cruise into New Zealand's captivating Bay of Islands, and to the watersports wonderland of Auckland.

LOS ANGELES, USA

Getty Museum • LAX-4689

Duration: 5 Hours

Transport: Air-Conditioned Coach



Experience a unique blend of architecture, nature, history and art during this scenic visit to the Getty Museum.

Depart the pier for the 1-hour drive to the Getty Center. This facility, uniquely-designed by architect Richard Meier, is located on a hilltop in the Santa Monica Mountains just off the San Diego Freeway. The Getty Center is home to the Getty Museum's collection of Western Art from the Middle Ages to present-day, and is set against a backdrop of dramatic architecture, tranquil gardens and breathtaking views over the Pacific Ocean, San Gabriel Mountains and city of Los Angeles.

Upon arrival, you will take a tram from the parking facility to the top of the hill. Clad in cleft-cut Italian travertine, the campus is organized around a central reception plaza, and offers framed panoramic views of the city. Curvilinear design elements and natural gardens soften the grid created by the travertine squares. Natural light is one of the Getty Center's most important architectural elements. The many exterior glass walls of glass provide plenty of natural light, and a computer-assisted system of louvers and shades adjusts the light indoors.

During your 3-hour, self-guided tour, you can explore five splendid gallery pavilions filled with European paintings, drawings, sculpture, illuminated manuscripts, decorative arts, and European and American photographs. The painting galleries on the museum's upper level are all naturally lit, with special filters to prevent damage to the artworks. Exterior courtyard spaces include fountains and a variety of trees, including Mexican cypress trees and a cactus garden to the south. The museum also houses a bookstore where you may purchase souvenir articles and books, and a restaurant for refreshments and snacks.

Following your visit, you will re-board your coach for the return drive to the pier.

Panorama of Downtown Los Angeles • LAX-1000

Duration: 3½ Hours

Transport: Air-Conditioned Coach



Experience an eclectic blend of movies, music, television and cultures during this panoramic orientation tour through downtown Los Angeles.

Depart the pier for a drive by some of the city's most famous landmarks. As you approach the downtown area, the Los Angeles Coliseum, site of the 1932 and 1984 Olympics, Museum of Natural History and University of Southern California will come into view. You will also see the Shrine Auditorium, home to Oscar and Grammy Award ceremonies, and the Staples Center, home of the Los Angeles Lakers, Clippers and Kings, concerts and other events.

The downtown area is a beautiful mix of old and new, where gleaming high-rises stand alongside historic treasures. Your tour will begin with a stop at the Music Center. The plaza is highlighted by an unusual water fountain, and surrounded by four world-class theaters and L.A.'s City Hall. Immediately south of the Music Center, you will see the dynamic stainless steel exterior of Walt Disney Hall.

Next, you will proceed for a visit to the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angeles, designed by the Spanish architect Moneo. The cathedral, completed in 2002, has virtually no right angles and took three years

to build. The outside walls resemble the sun-baked adobe walls of the California Missions. Special features include large alabaster windows, 25 earth-tone tapestries and 135 life-sized saints from all parts of the world. The lower level houses a Crypt Mausoleum with spectacular large stain glass windows. Actor Gregory Peck was the first to be buried in the mausoleum.

A brief stop will then be made at Olvera Street, the birthplace of Los Angeles. Upon arrival, you might hear lively Mariachi music and see the vibrant colors of Mexican handicrafts, sidewalk stalls and cafés.

Following your visit, you will be transferred back to the pier.

Queen Mary in Long Beach • LAX-1001

Duration: 3 Hours

Transport: Air-Conditioned Coach



Explore the beauty and legacy of one of the world's most renowned passenger ships during this visit to Long Beach, and a self-guided tour of the *Queen Mary*.

Depart the pier for the scenic drive to Long Beach. Your tour begins with a ride across the Vincent Thomas Bridge, the third-largest suspension bridge in California. Along the way, you will take in magnificent views of greater Los Angeles, and the Ports of Los Angeles and Long Beach. With 43 miles of waterfront, both ports rank among the world's busiest and largest man-made harbors. In the 1950s, this area was known to have the largest oil fields before the discovery of oil in Saudi Arabia. As you cross over the second bridge, or Desmond Bridge, the skyline of Long Beach and red smokestacks of the *Queen Mary* will come into view. The *Queen Mary* was permanently docked in Long Beach in 1967. Adjacent to the ship is the white geodesic dome, once home to Howard Hughes' flying boat, the *Spruce Goose*.

Upon arrival at the *Queen Mary*, you will be able to explore this grand ship and watch her history unfold during a self-guided walking tour spanning most of her decks. Most public areas aboard the *Queen Mary* have been restored to capture the Art Deco-style that gave the ship her unique character when she served as a vital transportation link between the Old and New World. During your tour, you will see the Engine Room, Propeller Box, Officer's Quarters, WWII exhibits, Isolation Ward, treasures from the *Queen Mary's* Archives and Art Gallery, and her three red smokestacks towering high into the sky.

Following your tour and wonderful harbor views from the Promenade Deck, you will rejoin your coach for a return drive to the pier via downtown Long Beach. As you enter Queensway Bay, the

Aquarium of the Pacific, Performing Arts Center, Convention Center and ten-story tall Planet Ocean will come into view. Marine artist Wyland painted Planet Ocean, which is the world's largest mural. You will then pass the former site of the Pike, the Coney Island of the West Coast from 1902 to 1969. Art-deco style buildings that date back to 1933 and survived the earthquake of that same year can be seen among the rebuilt modern architecture and skyline of Long Beach.

PLEASE NOTE: The tour of the *Queen Mary* is self-guided, and includes a moderate amount of walking.



NUKU HIVA, MARQUESAS ISLANDS

Tamure Welcome at a Sacred Marae • NHT-5162

Duration: 2 Hours

Transport: Local Transportation



This unforgettable voyage into the heart of Polynesian culture is included with our compliments for all guests.

The Marquesas Festival of Arts takes place once every four years in the remote Marquesas Islands. For your entertainment, the people of Nuku Hiva will organize a Mini-Festival of Arts that captures their culture, traditions and splendid talents.

Upon transferring from the ship to the pier in Taiohae, you will be welcomed by the traditional sound of drums, or *mave mai*.

Transportation from the pier is rustic, and runs on an irregular schedule. You may opt to walk, or board an off-road jeep or truck for the drive to Koueva, an archeological site restored in 2000 for the Marquesas Festival of Arts. Upon arrival, you will see the vivid emerald colors of the lush vegetation burst forth in sharp contrast with the basaltic rocks, and discover the arts of tattooing, weaving, and stone and woodcarving.

Next, you will take a guided tour to learn about the history and tradition of this ancient, yet festive site. After a buffet of local Marquesian fare, you will discover the world of the Koueva, and encounter the friendly, smiling and hospitable people of this Polynesian culture. Upon returning to the ship, the highlight of the day will be a spectacular Marquesian show performed in your honor around the pool (weather permitting).

PLEASE NOTE: *Due to the strong tropical sun and little available shade, a hat, sunglasses and sunscreen are essential. Mosquito repellent is also highly recommended. Transportation is limited on this remote island, and all available will be used for the shuttle to-and-from the event. Your patience is appreciated, as there may be some lines.*



In Paul Gauguin's Footsteps • PPT-1615

Duration: 3½ Hours

Transport: Air-Conditioned Coach



Take a walk in the footsteps of Paul Gauguin and explore the museum that bears his name during this scenic tour of Tahiti.

Depart Papeete for the drive along the west coast of Tahiti. Upon arrival in the residential district of Punaauia, you will visit the Museum of Tahiti, along with the islands located on Fisherman's Point, or La Pointe des Pecheurs. At the museum, you will view numerous archeological finds on display, learn about the island's geology, flora and fauna, and explore the culture and customs of both ancient and modern-day Tahiti.

Next, your drive will continue on to the Paul Gauguin Museum, which is nestled in a spacious garden. Gauguin lived in Polynesia from June 1891 to August 1893 and again from August 1895 to May 1903, the time of his death in the Marquesas Islands. The museum features a few of Gauguin's original works, and an interesting retrospective of his life in the islands as told through his documents, letters, writings and household objects. There is also a miniature display of Gauguin's work that depicts the location of all of his paintings. On the return drive along the west coast road, a brief stop will be made at a grotto where Gauguin once swam. After a short walk, you will come upon the *marae* of Arahurahu, a sacred site situated in a beautiful valley.

Following your Tahitian tour, you will re-board your coach for the return drive to the pier.

Island Discovery • PPT-6168

Duration: 7 Hours

Transport: Air-Conditioned Coach



Discover Tahiti's unique history, charms and interesting sites during this full-day orientation tour of the island.

Depart the pier for the drive towards Tahiti's east coast. En route, a stop will be made at the James Norman Hall House. This home displays the daily environment of this poet and writer of contemporary American literature. You will then continue on to Matavai Bay and pass by the Tahara'a Viewpoint before reaching Point Venus, the historic landing site for most European discoverers and evangelists. It boasts the island's only lighthouse, which was built in 1867. A brief stop will then be made to browse for locally-made goods at the adjacent handicrafts center.

Next, you will continue down the south coast of the island. Along the way, you will pass along the steep coastline until you reach the isthmus of Taravao that links Little Tahiti, or Tahiti Nui, and Small Tahiti, or Tahiti Iti. A visit will then be made to the Paul Gauguin Museum. Upon arrival, some free time will be made for you to explore the small museum, learn about Paul Gauguin and browse for souvenirs of your visit. While the museum does not display any original major paintings, it offers a good retrospective on the life and work of the artist.

After a lunch consisting of salads, hot and cold buffets, and desserts served at the Gauguin Restaurant, you will continue on for a visit to the Spring Garden of Vaipahi. This haven of tranquility features tropical plants, trees and refreshing springs.

Your tour will conclude with a visit to the interesting Museum of Tahiti and Her Islands. Located in Punaauia on Tahiti's west coast, the museum displays a large array of archeological finds, Polynesian artwork and costumes that tell the story of ancient Tahiti.

Following your visit, you will re-board your coach for the return drive to the pier.

Following an intimate dinner and overnight stay, you will be transferred back to the pier and ship.

January 22, 2009 – Papeete/Moorea

Upon disembarking the ship, walk to the ferry pier for your ferry ride to Moorea. On arrival, you will be met and transferred to the Pearl Resort. Local craftsmen have incorporated bamboo, *pandanus*, *tapa* cloth and other exotic local materials into the design of the resort, thus lending an authentic Polynesian ambiance to this idyllic enclave. Upon arrival, you will receive a welcome drink and *lei*. After check-in, the rest of the day will be spent at your leisure.

During your stay, you will have access to a wide array of amenities, including the beach, kayaking, canoeing, a swimming pool with Jacuzzi, table tennis and snorkeling. Dinner will be served at the resort's Le Matiehani Restaurant, with the rest of the evening to be spent at your leisure. As your bungalow appears to float in the haze above a sparkling blue lagoon, the peaceful sounds of the crystal-clear water lapping around the stilts and distant waves breaking on the shore will round out this intimate natural setting for two in grand style. Overnight at the Pearl Resort-Moorea.

Tahiti Lagoon Discovery with Snorkeling • PPT-6167

Duration: 3 Hours

Transport: Covered Boat



Embrace the undersea beauty of Tahiti's blue waters during this scenic and memorable lagoon discovery tour.

Depart the pier aboard a covered boat for the ride to your snorkeling site. Depending on the weather conditions (winds and currents), you will journey to Tahiti's east or west coast.

East Coast: After a brief tour through the harbor of Papeete, you will see the fisherman's wharf, then make your way to the east coast

of the island. Your Captain will anchor off the Tahara'a Coast, where you will be able to dive in the refreshing waters of Matavai Bay. Masks and snorkels will be available for those who wish to discover some of the sea life living by the coastal reef. Fresh fruits will be offered during the tour, and water will be available throughout the excursion.

West Coast: After a little tour in the harbor of Papeete, you will see the fisherman's wharf and make your way to Tahiti's west coast. Along the way, you will pass by the Tahiti International Airport and Sheraton, Beachcomber and Sofitel Hotels. After taking a relaxing boat ride to the reef, you will anchor off the airport for some swimming and snorkeling. Masks and snorkels will be available for those who wish to discover the abundance of tropical fish living in these waters. Depending upon underwater visibility, you may be able to see some of the wrecks that lay on the sandy bottom of these turquoise waters.

At the conclusion of your visit to either coast, you will be returned to the pier.

PLEASE NOTE: *Itinerary and stops may be reduced or alternated dependent upon weather conditions. Guests should know how to swim and be comfortable wearing snorkeling equipment, being in deep water and coping with occasional currents. Depending upon sea levels, boarding the boat in Tahiti may require guests to step up or down a high step. This tour is recommended for guests in good physical condition. Guests may remain in the boat, but viewing will be limited from there. The presence of marine life is not guaranteed, and tickets are non-refundable should a sighting fail to occur. For your own safety and to help us preserve our environment, do not touch or step on coral reef while snorkeling. Reef shoes are recommended. There are no restroom stops on this tour.*

Tahiti's Natural Treasures • PPT-6166

Duration: 4½ Hours

Transport: Air-Conditioned Coach



Tahiti's natural treasures and splendid vistas are yours to discover during this picturesque journey to the island's east and south coasts.

Depart the pier for the drive towards Tahiti's east coast. En route, a stop will be made at the Tahara'a Viewpoint. Here, you will take in magnificent views and photo opportunities of the island of Moorea and Matavai Bay, which features black-sand beaches and green cliffs.

Next, you will continue on to the Arahoho Blowhole, where you will see the ocean blowing out powerful gusts of wind from underneath the coastal road at high tide. From here, you will take a brief walk to the three waterfalls. While a walk up to the furthest one would be good exercise, your guide will allow you some time to appreciate the first water slide; a good photo opportunity.

Leaving the falls, you will proceed for a drive down the island's south coast. En route, you will pass by the steep coastline until you reach the Spring Garden of Vaipahi, which is home to rare species of precious wood and tropical flowers. A brief stop will then be made at the famous Papara Surf Beach, one of the island's nicest black-sand beaches and an ideal surfing spot for the best local surfers.

During the drive back to Papeete, a stop will be made at the *marae* of Arahurahu, an ancient sacred site surrounded by tropical trees and flowers. Following this peaceful visit to one of the island's nicest restored archeological sites, you will re-board your coach for the return drive to the pier.

PLEASE NOTE: *The duration of the tour is approximate, and is dependent upon traffic conditions around the island. The itinerary and order of stops may vary. Wear comfortable clothing and reef shoes, and bring sunscreen, a hat and sunglasses from the ship. Access to the waterfalls includes walking over uneven and slippery stones. Reef shoes are recommended.*

Tahiti – Off the Beaten Path • PPT-4626

Transport: Off-Road Vehicle



Explore a side of Tahiti not commonly seen by visitors during a scenic off-road journey through this idyllic island.

Depart the pier with your guide in an off-road vehicle for the scenic drive through Tahiti's pristine interior. You will then drive towards the east coast, and on to the Papenoo Valley. Along the way, you will pass by cascading waterfalls, luxuriant tropical vegetation, exotic flowers and lush valleys offering wonderful views and photo opportunities. You may opt to take a refreshing dip in a river while en route. Your sightseeing itinerary will depend on the weather and track conditions during your visit.

Following your tour, you will be returned to the pier.

PLEASE NOTE: *As this tour involves travel in off-road vehicles over bumpy surfaces, guests with back and/or neck problems are discouraged from participating. The itinerary may be modified due to weather conditions. Guests who wish to take a dip in the waterfall's pool should wear a swimsuit under a cover-up, and bring a towel from the ship. There are no changing facilities. Sunscreen, a hat and sunglasses are strongly advised. Your driver will also be your guide, and commentary will be limited.*

Transport: Off-Road Vehicle



If you love photography, then don't miss this unique and exclusive half-day guided tour of Moorea with accomplished professional photographer Renaud Sayada.

Accompanied by Renaud, you will depart the pier aboard a private, off-road vehicle for a guided photo tour of Moorea. Renaud will offer photographic tips and interesting information about the island throughout the tour.

Your tour will begin with a drive to the interior of the island along large pineapple fields, and past sub-tropical forests dotted with ancient archeological sites. En route, a stop will be made at Belvedere's lookout point for spectacular views and photo opportunities of Rotui, a beautiful mountain separating Cook's Bay and the pristine Opunohu Bay.

Next, you will drive along the coastal road to the island's west coast, where you will take expansive views of lush green vegetation, beautifully manicured gardens, a turquoise blue lagoon and the Pacific Ocean's endless horizon.

Weather permitting, you will see sites that include the famed Magic Mountain, which overlooks the northern part of the island and offers spectacular aerial views of the barrier reef. The highlight of this photo-adventure tour will include visits to off-road locations in the island's interior. Additional sites to be seen include the Papetoi fishing village, and the interior of the crater. Refreshments will be served during the tour.

northern coast, then on to a pair of French Polynesia's most beautiful bays; Cook's and Opunohu. En route, you can sit back and relax on the nets located in the bow, or savor a fruit juice under the canopy astern while listening to the sounds of Polynesian rhythms.

Upon reaching Opunohu Bay, the captain will drop anchor in the clear blue waters of a coral garden. After receiving your safety and snorkeling instructions, your crew will guide you on an interesting and refreshing snorkeling discovery. Your crew will provide you with assistance in the water, and throughout the tour.

Afterward, you will set sail along the beautiful coral reef towards Cook's Bay before returning to your ship.

Explore Moorea's exquisite beauty and day-to-day Polynesian lifestyle during this scenic orientation drive around the island.

Depart the pier for a scenic and relaxing drive around Moorea. The distance around this idyllic island is approximately 38 miles, or 62 kilometers, and offers many spectacular sites and photo opportunities. You will ride past pineapple fields and visit an ancient Tahitian stone temple, or *marae*, en route to Belvedere. You will also take in magnificent views of Cook's Bay, Opunohu Bay and Mt. Rotui. During the ride, your guide will provide you with commentary about the daily lives of the Polynesian island residents.

Next, your drive will continue on through the village of Papetoai and past the nearby tombs of the first missionaries. After a brief restroom stop near the Black Pearl Gem Company shop or Tahia Collins shop, your coach will return to the pier via the other side of the island. Along the way, you will pass through the districts of Haapiti and Afareitu, then make a photo stop at the Ia Ora lookout point before arriving at the pier.

PLEASE NOTE: *The order of sites visited may vary. The restroom stop near the shopping center will be the only restroom stop made on this tour. The guide's commentary features information pertaining to daily living in Moorea; but does not include historical, cultural, or political facts or details.*

Lagoon Discovery with Snorkeling • MOO-2235

Transport: Covered Boat



Experience the beauty of Cook's and Opunohu Bay from above and below sea level during this snorkeling and beach adventure aboard a modern covered boat.

Depart the pier aboard a comfortable and modern boat featuring covered areas designed to protect you from the direct rays of the sun. As you cruise along these majestic bays, your captain will inform you about the legends, geography, fauna and flora of Moorea.

Next, you will continue on to a gorgeous sandy islet surrounded by transparent turquoise waters that are shallow enough to walk comfortably in the sea. Upon arrival, you will have a rare opportunity to feed the awaiting rays; they will gracefully glide around you in exchange for a piece of fish.

Your tour will conclude with a stop at another uninhabited islet nearby. Here, you will be served refreshments, and have an opportunity to explore the beach and swim. You will also be invited to go snorkeling in water 6-10 feet deep, or 2-3 meters. Snorkeling is performed in the shallow waters off the boat, providing an excellent opportunity for beginner and experienced snorkelers. The boat's ladders extend deep into the water, making it easy to embark and disembark the craft.

Following your visit, you will be transferred back to the pier.

Fins are not provided, nor permitted, on this tour. The snorkeling locations selected may vary depending upon lagoon conditions that include current and visibility. Transport: Air-Conditioned Coach

Depart the pier for the scenic drive around Moorea, a gorgeous island that grows French Polynesia's most delicious pineapples. During your drive, you will also pass by some of the many pineapple plantations covering the mountains of the island.

Next, a stop will be made at a *marae*, or ancient sacred temple. Here, you can acquaint yourself with the Polynesian culture. Don't miss a unique opportunity to observe the behavior of sharks in their natural habitat during this exciting and educational shark dive that is suitable for beginners.

Depart the pier aboard a Zodiac boat for the ride to the Scuba Shark Gallery. Upon arrival, your guide will provide you with your safety and diving instructions, then lead you into the water for an exciting and educational shark dive. You will observe the behavior of sharks in their natural habitat, and discover why their bad reputation is not deserved. The black-tipped sharks that live here will come near the surface to welcome you, and be present throughout the dive. At times, a larger lemon shark will make an appearance. The maximum depth of your dive will not exceed 40 feet, or 12 meters. Following your dive, you will be returned to the pier.

PLEASE NOTE: *Guests must present a dive certification card, and proof that they have dived within the last two years. Wear a swimsuit under a cover-up, and bring sunscreen, a hat, sunglasses and a towel from the ship. This tour is recommended for guests in good physical condition. Scuba The Ledges – Certified Divers • MOO-1998

Transport: Zodiac



Embrace Moorea's exquisite undersea beauty during this picturesque scuba adventure along the ledges of a coral reef.

Depart the pier aboard a Zodiac boat for the ride to the ledges of a coral reef. Similar to fingers on a hand, these narrow points of coral were formed by thousands of years of surging water and extend from the reef for more than 200 feet. The fingers start at a depth of 30 feet, and extend to 120 feet or more. The sides and top of each extension

are rich in hard coral of various species. Upon arrival, your guide will outfit you with your equipment, provide you with your safety and diving instructions, then lead you into the crystal-clear waters.

Sharks, Javanese green moray eels and multicolored tropical fish abound inside this reef, and are constantly moving about in search of food. However, your dive will take place outside of the reef, where the clearest water and some of Polynesia's finest coral formations can be found. The maximum depth of your dive will not exceed 50 feet, or 15 meters.

Following your dive, you will be returned to the pier.

PLEASE NOTE: *Guests must present a dive certification card, and proof that they have dived within the last two years. Wear a swimsuit under a cover-up, and bring sunscreen, a hat, sunglasses and a towel from the ship. This tour is recommended for guests in good physical condition. Next, you will be seated at a table set especially for you in the crystal-clear waters, then be served a bottle of champagne while admiring the beautiful scenery. Other refreshments and light snacks will be served.

Following your boat tour, you will be returned to the pier.

PLEASE NOTE: The tour cost is per-boat, which can accommodate up to four guests. When requesting online or via fax, select only one ticket. Wear your swimsuit under a cover up with aqua socks or similar, and bring sunscreen, a hat, sunglasses and a towel from the ship. The boat has a sun top. As you journey out across this fabulous lagoon, your guide will inform you about the teeming marine life beneath your feet, as well as the visually-stunning ecosystem that exists above the waterline. These interesting facts will make each discovery all the more interesting, and enhance your appreciation of Bora Bora's natural beauty.

Before heading back to the pier, you will observe a crewmember dive under the boat and feed schools of fish right under the glass.

Helicopter Flightseeing • BRB-1607

Transport: Helicopter and Local Transfer



Experience Bora Bora's exquisite topography from a unique perspective during this picturesque flightseeing tour via helicopter.

This site has steep coral slopes dotted with mushroom-like coral formations, or porites, where tropical fish hide and feed. At 50 feet, you will discover a white sandy valley over which eagle rays fly. While admiring the imbedded Polynesian clams, you may even see a gigantic Javanese moray eel make an appearance. You will also see big triggerfish, clownfish, sea anemones and octopus. Following your dive, you will be returned to the pier.

Upon entering the water, you will be greeted by inquisitive butterfly fish and angelfish. This site has steep coral slopes dotted with mushroom-like coral formations, or porites, where tropical fish hide and feed. At 50 feet, you will discover a white sandy valley over which

eagle rays fly. While admiring the imbedded Polynesian clams, you may even see a gigantic Javanese moray eel make an appearance. You will also see big triggerfish, clownfish, sea anemones and octopus.

Following your dive, you will be returned to the pier.

After embarking your glass-bottomed boat at the pier, you will depart for a brief cruise. Your guide will then tie the boat to a mooring in about 25 feet of water, and try to attract black-tipped sharks. You will observe the dance of these ocean denizens, and if you are lucky, spot some lemon sharks known to frequent the area. Next, you will proceed to a shallower, clear lagoon for a rare opportunity to view, embrace and swim with graceful stingrays.

Following your tour, you will be transferred back to the pier.

PLEASE NOTE: Underwater viewing takes place through large glass windows. The roof provides protection from the sun and eliminates glare, enhancing photo and video quality. Swimming is not permitted during the first stop with sharks, but is highly recommended with the stingrays. Wear your swimsuit under a cover up, and bring biodegradable sunscreen, a hat, sunglasses, a towel, mask, and snorkel from the ship. Although shark and stingray sightings frequently occur, they cannot be guaranteed.

Along the way, you will see an abundance of tropical and multi-colored fish, including parrotfish and butterfly fish. At the conclusion of your snorkeling session, you will be transferred back to the pier.

PLEASE NOTE: *Guests should be comfortable in deep water and wearing snorkeling equipment. Although marine life sightings are frequent, they cannot be guaranteed. This tour is recommended for guests in good physical condition. Guests are encouraged to wear a swimsuit under a cover-up with aqua socks or similar, sunscreen, bring a hat, sunglasses and a towel from the ship. Masks, snorkels and personal buoyancy aid (P.B.A./snorkeling vests) will be provided.*



Submarine Adventure • BRB-6703

Transport: Transfer Boat and Submarine



Discover the diverse and abundant marine life of the South Pacific during this brief but exciting submarine adventure in Bora Bora.

As your ship enters the harbor in Avatiu, a warrior dressed in traditional costume will greet you with a traditional welcome chant as performed during the arrival of voyaging canoes in pre-missionary days. The sounds of the drums will accompany the chant as the vessel docks at the harbor side; a fitting welcome to these beautiful South Sea islands.

As you disembark to go ashore, you will be greeted by the friendly islanders and presented with fresh flower leis in the custom of the islands. If you have decided to explore ashore on your own, you will be briefed on your surroundings, and advised on what to see and do. Maps of the island and the main township will be provided for those wanting to go on a self-guided tour of the town and nearby villages. A full-service tent situated on the dockside will provide an information service desk, including banking and postal services, water and a refreshment station.

The fish are extremely tame and used to swimmers, and will take food from your hand.

A rustic barbecue lunch will then be served on an uninhabited offshore island just across from the Muri Beach Resort, and complemented by singing and a sarong-tying show. The lunch menu for this barbecue is typically comprised of fresh fish, usually tuna, wahoo or sailfish accompanied by potato salad, coleslaw and seasonal fruit.

Following your cruise, you will be transferred back to the ship.

PLEASE NOTE: *Wear your swimsuit under a cover-up, and bring sunscreen, a hat, sunglasses and a towel from the ship. Lunch includes water and orange juice. The boat is covered, and features a water access ladder. There are no restroom facilities on the boat. Snorkeling equipment will be provided.*

Transport: Non-Airconditioned Local Transportation



Discover the wisdom of Pa, one of the Cook Island's best known traditional healers, during this informative guided nature trek.

Depart the pier for the drive to the interior of the island. Upon arrival, you will join your guide on a trek along an ancient pathway used by Pa's ancestors before the missionaries arrived. Along the way, your guide will share Pa's in-depth knowledge of medicinal plants, and the culture and history of these islands. He will also provide demonstrations on the preparation of various traditional medicines and their applications. Bottled water and seasonal fruit will be served at Pa's residence.

Following your visit, you will be transferred back to the pier.

PLEASE NOTE: *This tour is recommended for guests in good physical condition. Guests with limited mobility and guests who utilize a wheelchair will not be permitted on this tour. Wear sturdy, closed-toe shoes, and bring sunscreen, a hat and sunglasses from the ship.*

PLEASE NOTE: As this tour involves travel over bumpy surfaces, guests with back and/or neck problems, and guests with limited mobility are discouraged from participating. Seating on the trucks is very basic. Sunscreen, a hat and sunglasses are recommended.

Rarotonga from the Air • RTG-4900

Transport: Cessna Plane



Experience Rarotonga's idyllic beauty in a unique new way during this scenic and exhilarating flight-seeing tour over the island.

Take to the air in the comfort of a Cessna 172, high-winged aircraft. This tour will provide you will a very different perspective of the island as you soar above the fantastic volcanic mountains, and fly through lush valleys dotted with remote tribal villages. Along the way, you will hear informative commentary from your pilot, and take in splendid vistas and photo opportunities.

Following your flightseeing tour, you will return to the pier.

Takitumu Conservation Tour • RTG-4897

Duration: 3¼ Hours

Transport: Non Air-Conditioned Local Transportation



Nature and bird lovers will especially relish this unique opportunity to explore Rarotonga's exotic bird and plant species during a memorable island conservation tour.

Depart the pier for the transfer to the Conservation Center. Upon arrival, you will begin your guided walking tour. Along the way, you will learn about conservation efforts involving the flycatcher, or kakerori, an indigenous bird found only on Rarotonga. Over the years, the bird's numbers have dwindled as a result of an increase in natural predators. Your visit, along with the visits of many hundreds of others, will provide the landowners with the funds needed to conduct research into various means of preserving and promoting this rare species of bird. The conservation area is also a tropical rain forest featuring many types of medicinal plants, and you will hear about the many local uses for such herbal remedies.

Following your walking tour, you will be returned to the ship.

PLEASE NOTE: This tour involves 2 hours of walking over uneven terrain, and is recommended for guests in good physical condition. Transfer to and from the conservation site will be in air-cooled buses. The tour will start from the gate, and there will be places to rest along the way. There are no restroom stops on this tour. All proceeds from this tour will go towards the Conservation Center.

Bay of Islands Coastal Scenes by Helicopter • BOI-006

Duration: 1 Hour (30-Minute Flight)

Transport: Local Transfer and Helicopter



Experience the stunning scenery of the Bay of Islands during this breathtaking flight-seeing tour via chartered helicopter.

Depart Waitangi Wharf for the brief transfer to nearby Paihia, where you will board your helicopter. After take-off, you will fly northeast over the township of Russell, then across the beautiful islands of Motuarohia, Moturoa and Motukieke. En route, you will take in spectacular panoramic views of beautiful sandy beaches and sparkling seas. You will fly as far north as Matauri Bay and the Cavalli Islands before returning via the Kerikeri Inlet and the townships of Kerikeri and Waitangi. During your flight, your pilot will provide you with an informative commentary about the area's early Maori and European history, its rich marine life and the unique geography of the area.

Following your helicopter tour, you will be transferred back to the Waitangi Wharf.

Explore the lovely inlets in the Bay of Islands during this scenic cruise aboard a touring catamaran launch.

Depart the pier aboard a catamaran for the cruise to the Bay of Islands. One of New Zealand's most beautiful marine areas, the Bay of Islands was made famous by English explorer James Cook and writer Zane Grey. As you journey through big-game fishing waters en route to the Cape Brett Lighthouse, you will be able to see beautiful Motukokako Island and the famous Hole-in-the-Rock from the catamaran's comfortable indoor and outdoor viewing decks. Next, you will proceed for the highlight of the tour, a trip to see the majestic Grand Cathedral Cave.

On the return voyage, some time will be spent meandering among the peaceful beauty of the inner islands, where you may see schools of dolphins and other marine life. Along the way, your captain will provide you with informative commentary about the area's history and marine life.

BAY OF ISLANDS, NEW ZEALAND

Kayaking on Waitangi Estuary • BOI-002

Duration: 4 Hours

Transport: Kayak



Experience the calm waters of the Waitangi Estuary in a unique new way during this scenic, half-day kayaking tour.

Depart the Waitangi Wharf with your kayaking guide for the walk across the Waitangi Bridge to your awaiting kayaks. After receiving your safety instructions, you will commence your kayaking tour of the beautiful Waitangi Estuary. Along the way, you will see a proliferation of mangrove trees, and their extensive root systems protruding out from beneath the water's surface. These unique trees are the lifeblood of this estuary, and a favorite breeding ground for many small fish.

At the end of the Waitangi Estuary you will reach the Haruru Falls, which are surrounded on one side by the beautiful Waitangi Forest. Although not especially high, the Haruru Falls are still a spectacular sight, especially after any recent rainfall. Light refreshments will be served at a picnic area near the falls before returning to the Waitangi Wharf.

PLEASE NOTE: *The Waitangi Estuary is normally very calm and well protected. Guests do not require any previous experience, as basic training is given. This tour is not recommended for guests with limited mobility. There is approximately 400 yards of walking from Waitangi Wharf to the kayaking center. Wear a bathing suit under shorts or a cover-up, beach shoes, a hat and sunglasses, and bring a jacket in case the weather turns cold. Participants must be at least 10 years old and accompanied by a parent. Guests have a choice of single or double kayaks. Please inform The Regent Travel Concierge on board of your preference at least 48 hours in advance. Final choice cannot be guaranteed.*

Kerikeri and Waitangi Highlights • BOI-004

Duration: 3½ Hours

Transport: Air-Conditioned Coach



Discover New Zealand's historic Maori and European influences during this scenic journey to Kerikeri and Waitangi.

Depart the Waitangi Wharf for the drive to Paihia, the commercial center of the Bay of Islands and site where one of the earliest missionary stations was established in 1823. You will then continue on to Kerikeri, where New Zealand missionaries built the first house, Kemp House, and adjacent Stone Store. Today, Kerikeri is a thriving citrus fruit growing area where much of New Zealand's oranges, lemons and grapefruit are grown. It is also a popular haven for artists and retirees.

Upon returning to Waitangi, you will visit the recently restored Waitangi Treaty House. It was here that the Maori chiefs signed over sovereignty of their lands to Queen Victoria of Great Britain in 1840. Most of the timber used to build this house, first lived in by British resident and acting Governor James Busby, was brought over from Sydney and later assembled on site.

Your tour will conclude with a stroll through the beautiful grounds of the Treaty House. Along the way, you will see the impressive Maori meeting place, or *marae*, and canoe, or *waka*. Upon reaching the lower end of the Treaty Grounds, you will be met and transferred back to the Waitangi Wharf.

PLEASE NOTE: *This tour involves approximately 100 yards to walk to the Kemp House and Stone Store, and about 700 yards of mostly downhill walking at the Waitangi Treaty House and grounds. There are 12 steps in the Stone Store to access the 1st floor (optional).*
